TAU CHAPTER CELEBRATES LODGE DEDICATION

Robert Hewitt '50 \$100,000 Challenge Extended

During the Tau Trustees Weekend on November 13, 450 Tau Chapter Brothers, friends, and guests gathered at 1002 West 26th Street to celebrate the completion of our 5,000-square-foot Lodge. This was made possible by the donation of more than \$3.5 million by our loyal alumni through the *Tau 125 Campaign*.

The Lodge dedication was truly a historical event, honoring Kappa Sigma as the leader in updated Greek facilities that provide fraternity men with state-of-the-art living and educational opportunities. Hundreds of parents, pledges, actives, and alumni filled the bright white-tented sport court. Attendees cheered the introduction of 51 pledges, the largest class in memory. A variety of awards were given to undergraduates and the Tau Man of the Year award went to **Hagen McMahon '66**. A bright orange ribbon was cut to announce that the new Lodge was open for business. Building the Lodge brings attention to the effort required to raise the remainder of our goal to build the Chapter House. We need \$1.5 million to complete what will surely be the number one facility in all of Kappa Sigma.

\$100,000 Challenge Extended

As our active members enjoy the newly completed Lodge, we are very proud of our efforts during this campaign thus far and are so appreciative of the Tau Chapter Brothers that have made a financial commitment.

The reality now is that we must raise additional dollars to begin construction on the Chapter House. Since announcing the \$100,000 two-for-one challenge in October, we have raised \$36,002 dollars. With such a great outpouring of support during the Lodge dedication in November, we have decided to extend the challenge. If you have not had a chance to give, and give deep, now is the time.
